
The winner of the lovely floral Raffle painting by Madelyn Albee went to Sandy McBeth....CONGRATULATIONS!

Paint the Town a great success! from Andrea Dudley

Nineteen artists spent a glorious early fall day painting scenes around downtown Wolfeboro at the 4th annual Paint the Town event on September 7. The participants attracted large crowds who enjoyed watching them paint. Their subjects ranged from boats along the waterfront, to rakes and wheelbarrows in front of Bradley's Hardware, to hydrangeas along Endicott Street.

The artists' "off the easel" works — along with other paintings they had brought with them — were on sale during the day in Cate Park. A percentage of the proceeds from those sales supports arts programs in schools and libraries in the Governor Wentworth Regional School District.

Priscilla Hodges Scholarship Funds Watercolor Workshop, Grants Artist's Stipend

Ten local artists completed the Priscilla Hodges Scholarship Fund's watercolor workshop in June. Held at Wolfeboro's Azure Rising Gallery, the workshop was conducted by noted artist Barbara Donnelly. GWAC members and friends had a chance to view the artists' work at a reception at the end of the workshop.

This year, the Priscilla Hodges Scholarship Fund also awarded a \$500 scholarship to Sandy Martin who will be attending a week-long workshop at the Hudson River Valley Art Studio of artist Alvaro Castagnet in Greenville, NY.

Adults in the Lakes Region who wish to attend classes or workshops to improve their artistic skills can apply for the Priscilla Hodges Scholarship. Applicants do not have to disclose financial information since the scholarships are not based on financial need. Former recipients may apply for funding two years after their last award.
