

The 32nd annual "Artists in the Park" fine arts festival will be celebrated on Wednesday, August 17th, 2011, in downtown Wolfeboro, Cate Park, on the waterfront. A small, but elite show, juried for originality and quality, it brings together some of the best fine art and crafts New England has to offer.

Johnathan Worthen, glass blower; Cheryl Kumiski, and Gigi LaBerge are stained glass artists offering fused glass panels and jewelry.

Ron Lee works in exotic woods and glass, creating unusual kaleidoscopes. Michelle Marson offers traditional basket shapes and Joaquin Mills works in hot copper, molding sculptures for the garden. Jeff Nelson from Hudson River-Inlay Co., will offer marquetry, wood inlaid mirrors and artwork.

Textiles are represented by Susan Arnold with gaily painted canvas floor cloths; Kathy Angel Lee with quilted pictures; Marty Schwartz produces belts and stylish leather handbags; and Karen Eames sells interesting ladies' fabric handbags. Heather Bell designs and hand paints silk wearables; Marie Reimensnyder stencils and paints charming images on cotton and linen shirts; and Dahlia Popovits weaves a line of gorgeous woven clothing.

Potters wares will be displayed by local artist and potter, Doug Blum; Nan Kilbourn-Tara working in terra cotta; Steve and Suzanne Russell with practical items, as well as one-of-a-kind Raku fired pots.

Jewelry is always a huge category, with artists working in stone settings, silver and gold, recycled materials, to found items. Thomas Kuhner, Marlene Reali, Chaya Caron work in silver and gold. Sholeh Regna works in porcelain; Susan Scribner-Reed collages paper jewelry-art, Jennifer Nielsen sets beach stones in silver, and Victoria Tane is an "artist extraordinaire" with recycled "stuff"!

Photography includes scenes from around the world and New England, as snapped by Ronal Wilson, Duncan Hall, George Kelly, and Stephen Eames. Bruce Peck offers etchings and Nancy Stillwagon stitches quaint trapunto paintings.

Denis Leblanc offers watercolor scenes of Maine; Bruce Iverson does Chinese brush painting; Fay Lee mixes it up with watercolor, acrylics, and mixed media collage; and local artist Suzanne Bonin offers watercolors and etchings. Roland Simard works in handcast pigmented paper pulp, adding texture to his works. (This is an art medium not often seen.) Elizabeth Craumer does pastels. Oil painters are represented by Stephen Previte, Ginny Nickerson, and Gail Johnson. Allison Barrows, creator of the nationally syndicated comic strip, PRE-TEENA, will be on hand working in pen, ink and watercolor and offering prints with her books.

The Mouse Ladies will once again take a child's fingerprint and artistically turn it into a character mouse, to the delight of all! They will be in the bandstand from 10am -12noon. Lesley Smith, a professional ventriloquist, will perform three mini-matinees: 1:30, 2:30, and 3:30pm. Brian Stockman, woodcarver, will bring work to demonstrate from 10am until 1pm and at 1pm Peter Ferber will set up his easel and demonstrate water color painting until 4pm.





The second annual "Paint the Town", sponsored by the Governor Wentworth Arts Council, will take place **Saturday, September 10th** (with a rain date of Sunday, September 18th.) This is a day of plein aire painting in Wolfeboro's charming "Oldest Summer Resort" in American. An invitation is now issued to all member artists of GWAC and an open invitation to other New England artists/painters to come and paint.

Artists will sign in at 9am. in Cate Park at the Community Bandstand, on the waterfront, where coffee and muffins will start the day. Artists will seek their spot in which to paint within walking distance in downtown Wolfeboro. "Runners" will pick up paintings during the day and take them to the bandstand for hanging. Paintings can be purchased from artists during the day, only if the purchaser and the artist return together to the bandstand to complete the sale. Artists will post the "take away" price. At 3:30pm artists will return to the bandstand for a Silent Auction. Those paintings that did not sell will go "home" with the artists

Artists will pay \$25.00 as registration to participate and will split 50/50 any sale of their paintings with the Governor Wentworth Arts Council. Applications can be picked up at The Art Place, Blue Shutter Gallery, Sandy Martin Gallery, or by e-mailing: muddywheel@metrocast.net.

GWAC - "TAG" Looking for Artists

A new addition to the GWAC, The Artists Group (TAG), is looking for artists to demonstrate at the GWAC monthly meetings (March – October) and to bring one or two pieces of artwork to each meeting where member artists will vote for their favorite pieces. These pieces will then be hung at the local participating businesses (all selected artists must volunteer for TAG in some capacity). So far, TD Bank is available for hanging artwork and starting in June, we will be hanging artwork at Ballentine Partners in Wolfeboro.

After the monthly business meeting, held at the First Congregational Church on Main St., in Wolfeboro, a demonstration by a local artist will take place – thus far we have had DJ Geribo demonstrate a still life using acrylics, Nancy Piper demonstrated an animal portrait using graphite, and Ilona Train (see above) demonstrated a few techniques she learned using pastels while she was in Florida this past winter. The monthly demonstrations are a wonderful opportunity for artists to learn new techniques from their fellow artists. Share your experiences with others, get involved with TAG.

We are looking for member artists to volunteer as Program Coordinator (finding monthly artists to demonstrate), to help with hanging and take down of artwork at the various locations, and to share your ideas for helping member artists get more exposure for their art. The Currier Museum of Art will present *A Chosen Path: The Ceramic Art of Karen Karnes*, celebrating Karnes' more than 60-year career at the forefront of the studio pottery movement. From her dramatic salt-glazed pottery of the 1960s and '70s, to her most recent complex joined sculptural pieces, Karnes (born 1925), of Morgan, Vermont, is one of the medium's most influential working potters and is a mentor to several generations of studio potters. Throughout her career, Karnes has created some of the most iconic pottery of the late twentieth and early twenty-first centuries. She has worked at some of the most significant cultural settings of her generation including North Carolina's avant-garde Black Mountain College and Gate Hill Cooperative in Stony Point, NY in the 1950s.

"Karen is one of the originators of the art pottery movement in the United States, and I am thrilled that the Currier was chosen as one of only a handful of venues to host the exhibition," said Kurt Sundstrom, associate curator, Currier Museum of Art.

WOLFEBORO – The Governor Wentworth Arts Council (GWAC), a nonprofit organization that promotes art initiatives in the Lakes Region, has launched a new web site. The site – located at: **wolfeboroarts.org** – features information about GWAC-sponsored exhibits, events, education initiatives and artist members.

The site was designed and developed by Danconia Media, a New Hampshire-based web design company. Funding for the site was provided by a grant from the Meredith Village Savings Bank Fund of the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation and generous members and friends of GWAC.

Using the site, visitors can learn about activities that GWAC holds in the Wolfeboro area, including *Artists in the Park*, *Paint the Town*, and *Just Desserts*, and the group's educational and community outreach activities.

In addition, artist members have the opportunity to be featured on the group's new site. Each artist can elect to have a write-up and three photos of their works, along with contact information, on the site. To date, several artists – including Madelyn Albee, Marcia Atkinson Christensen, DJ Geribo, Duane Hammond, Sandy Hammond, Jerome Holden and Nancy Lane Piper – have opted to promote their work via the site. Visit the site and tells us what you think.

Debbie Hopkins, president of GWAC, said, "For many years, GWAC has sponsored arts and educational activities in the community. This site gives us an opportunity to make more people aware of our work and to get them involved. "Also, with the development of this web site members of the arts community in the Wolfeboro area have a platform to display their work and a vehicle to exchange information."

GWAC membership is open to anyone with an interest in the arts. The group generally meets once a month in the Wolfeboro area. Members receive a quarterly e-newsletter, regular email updates, advance notice of events and activities, the opportunity to participate in area exhibits, and the knowledge that they're supporting the growth of the arts in the community and the schools.

The new web site was developed using WordPress as a content management system (CMS), giving GWAC members the ability to add, remove and modify content without relying on a third-party agency.
