

GWAC Visual Arts Scholarship

It is my pleasure to announce, once again, the availability of an art scholarship to local students who may need financial assistance to attend a degree-granting college to pursue their Arts degree after attaining their high school diploma in 2013. This award is open to home-schooled students as well.

The award is called "The GWAC Visual Arts Scholarship" and it will be given to a student(s) who has completed the general Common Application (provided through Kingswood High School) as well as provide their college portfolio on disk accompanying the application to us. Disk must contain title, medium and size of piece(s) all high resolution, .jpg files. Portfolio content may contain; traditional artwork (painting, drawing, sculpture, pottery, crafts etc.) as well as photography, jewelry, web design, graphic design, set design, fashion design, 3D animation, video and film.

This award will be made available through the KRHS Guidance office and will be open to home-schoolers completing their academic requirements as well as graduating seniors. Students must be accepted, and show proof of acceptance, to the accredited college when applying for this scholarship.

The combination of the Common Application as well as their current portfolio is to be submitted by **April 1st**, **2013** to: **the GWAC Visual Arts Scholarship Chair**, **Jeannette D'Onofrio**, **17 Grove St. Wolfeboro NH 03894** and will be reviewed by the GWAC Visual Arts Scholarship Committee. The monetary award may be presented in person at the Awards Night at Kingswood High School.

The Postcard Age
Selections from the Leonard A.
Lauder Collection

In the decades around 1900, postcards were Twitter, e-mail, Flickr, and Facebook, all wrapped into one. A postcard craze swept the world, as billions of cards were bought and mailed, or just pasted into albums. Many famous artists turned to the new medium, but one of the great pleasures of postcards is how some of the most beautiful and interesting cards were made by artists whose names we barely know. This unprecedented exhibition traces how big historical and cultural themes of the modern age—enthralling, exciting, and sometimes disturbing—played out on the postcard's tiny canvas.

"The Postcard Age" features about 400 cards by a wide variety of artists and publishers from throughout Europe and the Americas. It is arranged not by style or country, but by theme, with sections devoted to, among other things, urban life, the changing role of women, sports, celebrity, new technologies, the stylish collectors' cards of the art nouveau, and World War I. The result is a vivid picture of the cares and concerns of the age and a tempting sampler of the artistic and historical riches found in the Leonard A. Lauder Postcard Archive, the lifetime project of Leonard Lauder and a promised gift to the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston.

An extraordinary loan from the Philadelphia Museum of Art gives you the opportunity to see two of the great master-pieces of French painting in America hanging side by side: Paul Cézanne's *The Large Bathers* and the MFA's own *Where do we come from? What are we? Where are we going?* by Paul Gauguin. Painted from 1900–1906 and 1897–1898, respectively, these works form a bridge from the 19th to 20th century and influenced a generation of modern artists that included Picasso and Matisse. Both pictures address a classical tradition of representing the idealized nude in an idyllic landscape, yet both also break with convention, conjuring radically new visions of earthly paradise. Exhibited together for the first time in Boston, the paintings will be on view as part of the MFA's Visiting Masterpieces series in the Sidney and Esther Rabb Gallery.
