Artist, lecturer, teacher **Tom Sutherland**, to be guest instructor at the *Spring Watercolor Workshop* sponsored by the *Priscilla Hodges Scholarship Fund* at Camp Northwood's Todaro Center in Tuftonboro, NH on Tuesday May 8th, Wednesday May 9th and Thursday May 10th from 9am until 4pm. Advance reservations have been filled, with one open seat remaining.

Longtime woodcarver Tom Sutherland figures he's designed and created over 4000 signs in a marquee career that has spanned 30 years. Then the civil engineer turned signmaker discovered the medium of watercolor painting.

In the ensuing 13 years the "speed-painter" of watercolors has sketched and brushed his way to producing somewhere between 3-4000 impressionistic representations of coastal landscapes and, in particular, cityscapes.

The Tempest is one of Shakespeare's finest! Huge thanks to GWAC for helping to sponsor the show this year!

The Tempest was written in 1610 and is one of William Shakespeare's last scripts penned for the stage. Even though The Tempest is a serious play, scholars consider it to be the playwright's comic masterpiece. The word comedy was defined differently in Shakespeare's day than it is today. In Elizabethan times, theater people embraced the definition of comedy set forth by the Greek playwright Aristotle. A comedy was a play that ended without anyone being killed. Although The Tempest has some humorous parts, it is usually staged as a serious play which examines questions of revenge and forgiveness, betrayal and loyalty, and the nature of romantic love.

GWAC Events - UPDATE

First Night[®] Wolfeboro 2012... In Review

Planning is moving ahead at excellent speed. We have set June 30 as a goal to have everything in place other than New Year's Eve volunteers and Button Sales people to gather up the weekly receipts.

Performer Applications have gone out to those we have decided to have return this year. Last year we out did ourselves and many people actually asked to have fewer selections, as they could not attend all of the performances. Accordingly we have pruned the schedule slightly. Also, we have moved the start time of many of the afternoon events to 3 pm, keeping the Walleye Clue Chase beginning at noon and the hamster races, Balloon making and launch, Magician and Face Painting/Hat and Mask Making, and the Wildlife Encounters at 2pm. Due to a very small number of attendees at the Planetarium this past year we have decided to give it a rest for a year.

To make the dinner hour easier, to allow easier set up for performers and to keep people in town for the midnight fireworks, we have made the dinner hour from 5 - 6:30 (parade and fireworks still scheduled for 5-5:30) with the evening performances beginning at 6:30 and on the half hour all along. This will result in the two 10:30 sessions finishing up at 11:30 so people can get to the fireworks but not have to wonder what to do between 11 and midnight.

Wes Matchett has asked to be relieved of the Data Base subscription cost and we have picked that up at \$19.95 a month with a 10% discount for prepayment of six months. This is an excellent database for any non-profit that has donors and wishes to track their contributions. We recommend it highly.

We had initially thought we would sell advertising in the program but a check on production prices for an expanded size vs. potential revenue over and above what we currently get from the business community showed very little up side and a potential for less net revenue so this idea has been abandoned.

We are presently researching using the Post Office's new every postal patron mailing to reach the entire Wolfeboro community with our fundraising pitch this year rather than just our shrinking base. The cost is almost the same and the results could be excellent.

We are still seeking active volunteers for a number of committee chairs.

The "Artists in the Park" committee is preparing for its 33rd annual fine arts show in Cate and Town Parks, on dockside, Wednesday, August 15, 2012, rain or shine. Applications by mail and e-mail were sent out in February and the returns are coming in by the day, with the deadline May 1st. A jury will convene in May to pick the 41 exhibitors to present their work in the show.

Committee chair, Debbie Hopkins, adds that, "Despite some poor sales reports from last years' event, the craftsmen and artists are still wanting to return." She attributes the shows' 33 year reputation for original and quality work, and the fact that GWAC volunteers make it a pleasant and easy show for the exhibitors. "Plus," she adds, "you can't beat the lovely setting by the shore of Winnipesaukee".

The biggest news is that last years' Peter Ferber poster will again represent this event. The committee felt it "said it all", from the setting in the background of the park, lake and mountains, to a border of art, represented many of the categories of wares one will see for sale. A new children's entertainer is under contract and local potter Doug Blum will choose a pottery creation for the annual auction. "There is every indication that we will have another great art event to look forward to," adds Debbie Hopkins.

Edgar Degas: The Private Impressionist will be the first comprehen-

sive exhibition at the Museum devoted to the 19th-century French master Edgar Degas and his works on paper. Comprised of more than 70 drawings, prints, pastels, and photographs as well as several sculptures, the exhibition will provide an insightful exploration of the oeuvre of one of the most skilled and complex artists in art history.

In addition to masterworks by Degas, the exhibition will include a select group of rare works on paper by artists of his circle, including captivating works by Mary Cassatt, Paul Cézanne, Jean-Auguste

Dominique Ingres, and Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec. To add even

greater depth to the exhibition, generous loans to the Museum from

major benefactor Scott M. Black including Degas' Portrait of Alexis
