






GWAC Participates in Annual FESTIVAL OF TREES 2015

Priscilla Hodges Scholarship Awarded from Nancy Piper

The Priscilla Hodges Scholarship committee is pleased to announce that it has awarded Corina Willette, from Ossipee NH a scholarship towards a residency at The Vermont Studio Center in Johnson Vermont commencing March 27 thru April 22, 2016. This residency will allow Corina four solid weeks of intensive studio work including mentor critiques. She will use this time to foster her creative work through "community and quiet studio practice". Corina, a graduate of NHIA with a BFA in Studio Arts, has exhibited widely throughout New Hampshire, Maine and Connecticut.

The Priscilla Hodges Scholarship Fund was established over 17 years ago and was formed in memory of Priscilla Hodges Saunders, a GWAC member and resident of Melvin Village who painted local landscapes and points of interest. She attended special workshops and seminars to increase her artistic skills and great enthusiasm for painting. With this enthusiasm and abundant energy she encouraged and inspired others to study and grow in their art. It was in this spirit that this scholarship was formed and is offered to other aspiring artists. Fifteen students registered for the Priscilla Hodges Scholarship Fund sponsored workshop September 15-17, 2015. The weather couldn't have been better for this plein air pastel workshop and Tuftonboro's lakeside YMCA Camp Belknap was the perfect venue. Artists were treated to morning muffins, breads and coffee and then watched as Robert Carsten demonstrated a variety of pastel techniques, most of them from an easel set up on the beach overlooking the lake, mountains and Farm Island directly off shore. The weather was so perfect that Robert had to use photos to demonstrate rendering clouds as there were none!

The group was invited to a pot luck supper after that first day of instruction at Helene's Pierce's lovely home in Wolfeboro where folks got to relax, get to know one another and chat informally with Robert all the while enjoying a delicious assortment of appetizers, entrees and desserts. Helene and her husband were most gracious hosts.

The next two days were filled with demonstrations and excellent information for the artists and very helpful critiques as well. The quality of the work that was produced was fantastic and the participants were very happy and inspired by this wonderful workshop. The evaluations returned by the participating artists were incredibly positive and can be summed up well by this "happy camper": "Indeed it was a wonderful workshop....so much information on plein air painting! 

A fashionista's dream, Killer Heels: The Art of the High-Heeled Shoe will present a 300-year history of fabulous footwear, revealing high heels as both stunning architectural creations and works of art in their own right. About 100 contemporary and 50 historical high heels will be on view, including shoes by noted designers Prada, Alexander McQueen, Jean Paul Gaultier, Miu Miu, Christian Louboutin, Ferragamo, Manolo Blahnik and more. Drawn from the collections of the Brooklyn Museum and the Bata Shoe Museum in Toronto, the exhibition includes six films created specifically for the show by noted artists, each exploring the cultural, social and aesthetic qualities that make the high heel so fascinating.
